FBHVC Matters

he Wolseley Register is a member of the Federation of Historic Vehicle Clubs which exist to uphold the freedom to use historic vehicles on the road. In *Wolseley World* we summarise key articles from the *FBHVC News*. For further information on any of the matters summarised below, please consult **www.fbhyc.co.uk**

London ULEZ: The London ULEZ has come into force. Historic vehicles are exempt as elsewhere in England and Wales.

Parking: Bath became the first town to consult on car park charges being related to exhaust emission results, or for older vehicles to engine capacity. The Federation responded suggesting that historic vehicles pay the lowest rate. There is no national policy, so each occurrence will have to be considered as they arise.

DVLA: DVLA confirmed that their contract with the Post Office to provide a counter service is due to end in June 2024 and that at this stage no decision has been taken regarding any future provision.

Fuels: Esso's Synergy Supreme+ 99 fuel will now contain up to 5% ethanol in all parts of the country.

Some of Twin-Cam's other videos feature the Wolseley 1500, Super Six, Mini Hornet, 18/85 and Ten.



In my last report, I was anticipating the small gathering of classic cars alongside steam rollers, traction engines, lorries and tractors at the annual Vintage Rally at the small West Sussex hamlet of Balls Cross.

This is a lovely event, held in beautiful countryside near the historic market town of Petworth. It is so low-key that it does not have a website, bookings to display vehicles are made by sending the organisers a stamped self-addressed envelope, and the collection for Macmillan cancer support is carried out by dropping money in a bucket on arrival. Yes, money! No cards.

The two-day event has an old-world feel to it, as befits the many and varied vintage vehicles on show. Steam engines trundle around between static displays to the sound of fairground organs and the rhythmic if rasping exhaust stroke of stationary engines.

My wife and I have visited in the past, but never as display entrants. This time I decided to camp and duly loaded up my 1956 Wolseley 4/44 with camping gear (taking me back to my youth when I camped all over Europe with it) and set up tent in a far corner of an adjoining field. My wife Mary joined me in our 1960 Series 2 Land Rover.





I had mentioned the event to South East Region members and hoped that a few would turn up on the Sunday. I was not disappointed, and we had five Wolseleys on show among about 50 classic cars — not a bad performance. The oldest among the Wolseley fraternity (car, not driver!) was Nelson Ferreira in his 1935 New 14. John Blackbourn journeyed up from Kent in his 1954 4/44 and we were pleased to be joined by Bryan and Jane Hare in their 1968 Hornet.

Bryan said: "We thought it would be good to support and mingle with other Wolseley owners. Given the hot weather we were grateful that we had a preprepared a cold box picnic and cold drinks, as on-site catering was somewhat sparse. We parked with other Register members, introduced ourselves and talked 'Wolseley'.

A few rows in front, and unknown to us, was a splendid dark green 6/110. Registered in February 1968, this would make it one of the very last before the model ceased production. Its owner was local, but not a Register member. He was not with his car when I dropped by for a chat, but his daughter said it was his "pride and joy" and he had undertaken a lot of restoration by himself. The sun shone throughout the day, and John and Nelson took shelter in the back seat of the New 14. The rally was well attended, and we were pleased to have the opportunity to fly the flag for Wolseley, the only marque to have five cars on display.

Elsewhere, SE member Roland Watson reports that he has had good, and bad times, with his Wolseley cars. His 6/80 is to feature in a forth-coming period drama set in 1955. This involved him taking it into central London, leaving home at 5am to arrive in time for a long day of filming. All went well with the car.



As for the film, Roly is sworn to secrecy about who stars in it and what it is about until nearer its release date. His car is photographed alongside a London taxi of the same period.

However, Roly continues to have problems with his 1938 16/65, which has had to be recovered for a third time. "Why did I take a car on the road with so many known problems and many others coming to light!", he laments. He is discovering that in the past, "everything on this car has been bodged". He is now stripping the engine to check all oilways for blockages.

The SE committee is meeting in November for its AGM and to consider a Christmas meal venue and I will update SE members by email.
